



- Dedicated processing center in your brain
- Scientific American Magazine Dedicated brain processing center for "hard-wired" tasks.
- Found in Language, reading (only 50% of people have this), chess grand masters, musicians.

# Benefits to our playing!

- Rapid recall of pieces and parts of pieces
- Fast muscle memory
- Accurate muscle memory
- Easy and automatic access to information in our brain => fluency
- More expressive music



### **Motivation and Revision**

- Eg. Beatles songs listened to repeatedly
- Play many times => wants to play many more

- Reason to play


Revision - How?

  - Minuet 2


Revision - Why?
